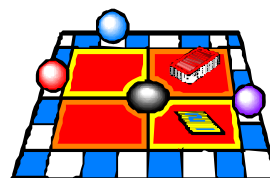

# You'll want to know . . .

## Dates

Summer School begins Monday, June 14 and ends Friday, July 9. There are no classes July 5.

## Times

Classes begin at 8:30, 9:40 and 10:50 AM. Each session will be 60 minutes long.

## Tuition

Tuition is \$120 per course hour unless otherwise noted. **If tuition is paid before April 17, 2010, a \$10 per course discount will be given.**

## Registration fee

\$10.00 (non-refundable)

If a student enrolls in 8:30 and 10:50 sessions and does not select a 9:40 session, the student will be enrolled automatically in a **Supervised Break** and a \$50 fee will be assessed.

**Payment** may be made by check, money order, Discover, MasterCard, or Visa. A processing fee of \$50 will be assessed on checks returned for insufficient funds.

*Please make checks payable to **District 68 Summer School.***

Payment must accompany registration forms. Your cancelled check will be your receipt.

## Registration

Parents may register children **online at [www.skokie68.org](http://www.skokie68.org) or by mail, fax, or walk-in.** Please use the form enclosed with this brochure. Additional forms are available in any school office or on our website. Classes are filled on a "first come, first served" basis. **It is important to register by April 17th because classes may be closed after that date due to insufficient enrollment.** When class enrollment falls short of the required minimum, the class is cancelled and the student is asked to select a different course, or a refund is made to parents. Parents are consulted prior to any change in the student's schedule.

## Grade Level

The student's 2010-11 grade level should be used on the registration form. Ex: If the student will complete fifth grade this June, register as a sixth grader.

## Confirmation of Classes

If you do not register in person, a postcard will be sent to confirm receipt of the requested classes. Schedules will be mailed during the second week of May for those registered before April 18th.

## Registration after June 9

Students who register between June 9 and June 11 will begin summer school classes on Tuesday, June 15, in order to guarantee staffing arrangements. Students who register after June 11 may start attending class one day after they register. Classes are not pro-rated due to late registration.

## Refunds

No refunds will be made except for medical reasons or cancellation of classes. No money will be refunded after June 1.

## Basic Classes

Basic classes are available by teacher recommendation only for students in District 68. Parents will receive notification by mail in February for Grades 4-8 or during parent/teacher conferences for Grades K-3. A separate registration form will accompany the notification. Students outside of District 68 may enroll if their reading or math assessment is below the national 40th percentile as verified by the neighboring school district. Attach verification to the registration form and place the course number in Period 1, 2, or 3 based on your preference. District 68 will notify you if that time is not available.

## Absences

Parents are to call the Absence Line 847-676-9129 to report a student's absence or late arrival to Summer School. Classes are not pro-rated for partial attendance.

## Anecdotal Reports

Anecdotal reports will be issued to students at the end of the session.

## Accident Insurance

School District 68 does not carry medical or health insurance for participants in summer school. Please review your family's personal health insurance plan to be certain that you have the proper coverage. Students covered under 24-hour accident insurance purchased through District 68 in September, 2009, are covered for summer school. There is no coverage for summer school under the school-time coverage option.

## Transportation

Bus service for students who are residents of District 68 is available for a fee. The cost per student rider is \$95.00.

Pick-up times start at 8:05 a.m. and 9:15 a.m. Drop off times will begin at 10:50 a.m. and 12:00 noon.

Parents who register their student(s) for bus service before April 17, will receive a schedule of stops in the mail. Bus stops are determined by May 1st.

## Student Pick-Up/Drop-Off at OOJH

The north driveway is for student pick-up and drop-off. Cars are prohibited from entering the south bus driveway during summer school hours. Parents should enter the north driveway through the north parking lot and pull their car as far forward as possible. Vehicles must be attended to at all times while in the driveway.

## Crossing Guards

The Skokie Police provide crossing guards for students during Summer School from approximately 8:10 AM to 12:10 PM at: Kenton Avenue in front of Old Orchard Jr. High School, Niles Center Road and Church Street; Skokie Boulevard and Church Street; and Gross Point Road and Church Street.

All summer school classes will be held at **Old Orchard Junior High School** with the exception of *Pre-Kindergarten Mini-Camp* which meets at the **Early Childhood Center**. All classrooms are air conditioned. Bus service for residents of District 68 is available for an additional fee of \$95.00.

**Pre-Kindergarten Mini-Camp**

Children must be four or five years old by September 1, 2010 or entering pre-kindergarten or kindergarten in the fall. In a mini-camp environment, the class assists children in social, mental, and physical development in a stimulating environment. Activities include arts and crafts, music, group games, motor facilitation, drama, field trips, and language experiences. Readiness skills are included.

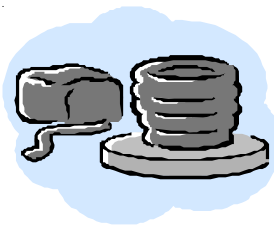

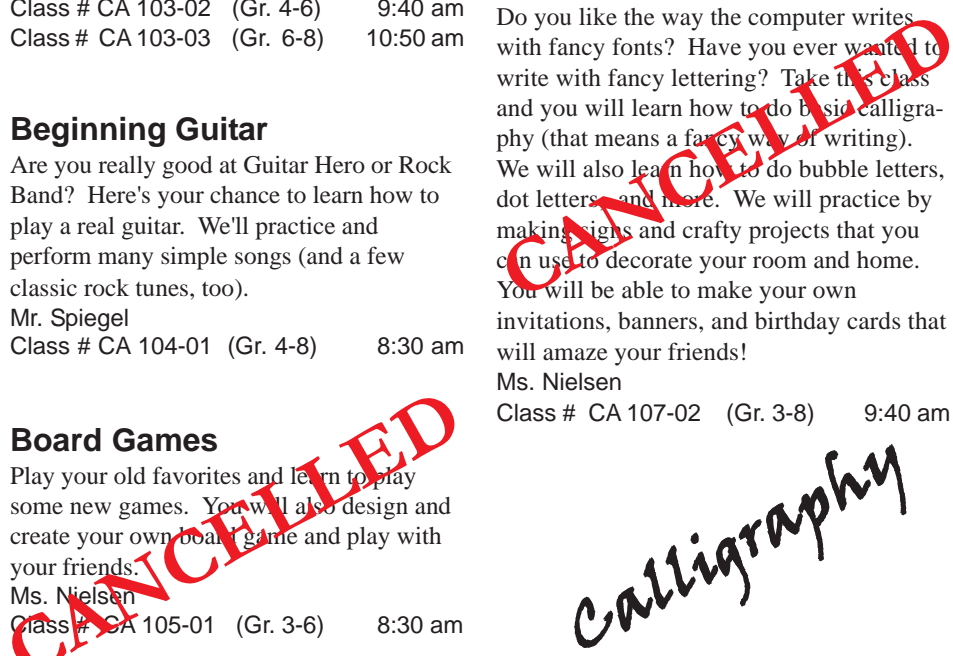

**PRIMARY:** In order to be eligible, primary grade students (Grades 1, 2, or 3 for Sept. 2010) must have assessment scores below the national 40th percentile on the AIMSweb or MAP tests at a District 68 school or comprehend below the State recommended reading level. Students from other school districts need to present information (achievement scores report) that they scored below the 40th percentile, or written documentation from their teachers that they are at least six months below grade level in classroom performance.

**INTERMEDIATE:** Intermediate grade students (Grades 4, 5 or 6 for Sept. 2010) must be achieving below the 40th percentile on national norms on the AIMSweb or MAP tests in the areas for which the basic class is desired. Students from other school districts need to present information (achievement score data) that they scored below the 40th percentile on national norms.

**JUNIOR HIGH:** Junior high students (Grades 7 or 8 for Sept. 2010) must be achieving below the national 40th percentile on the AIMSweb or MAP tests in the areas for which the basic class is desired. Students from other school districts need to present information (achievement score data) that they scored below the 40th percentile on national norms.

## About the District 68/Skokie Park District Summer Program
